A Letter Sent to Ann Landers:


I realize that a great many men and women have lost people they love in the many wars our country has fought, but I have had more than my share of such grief. When I was little, my father died in the Korean War. My older brother was a paratrooper in Vietnam and was killed when he was barely 19. My husband died in the barracks that were bombed in the Persian Gulf. Now I have a teen-age son who tells me he wants to go to West Point and be a commissioned officer in the Army. I am really frightened....I have prayed, cried and have found no answers. What do you suggest?

Ann responded: There is nothing you can or should do. If your son has his heart set on a career in the military, it would be unfair to attempt to change his mind. This decision should be his and his alone.

Do you agree with Ann's advice? What guidance does the Fourth Commandment give to this situation?
