MONEY HAS VALUE

Key Concepts

- Money Has Value
- Teach the children that each coin has a value.
- Teach the children that everything we own has value.
- Teach the children about bartering.

2 Teacher Preparation

- Bring in real coins for the children to see.
- Look up pictures online to see what coins from different countries look like.
- Bring in money from other countries so they can see it.

3 Lesson

- Long ago people didn't have money.
- People used what they had to trade goods.
 - This is called bartering.
- · Bartering is trading what you have to get other goods that you need.
- Even when you are trading goods, those goods had a value to them.
 - They were worth something to the other person.
- Today we have coins and paper money.
- Bartering still does happen today, but not as much here in the US.
 - We have money that has value.
 - Each coin is worth something.
- Let's look at the coins and say how much each is worth.
 - Go through the coins.
 - On the paper money, each value is labeled.
- We use our money to buy the things we need.
 - God has given us all that we need, including the money.
 - He gives us jobs and we can earn the money.
 - Some of us get allowance and we earn money that way.
 - We can do things for other people to earn money.
- God wants us to use our money the best that we can.
 - He doesn't want us to waste money.
 - We need to use what we have to help others and help the church.

Money has different value. God wants us to use our money wisely. Learning what money is worth helps us to use it wisely and not spend it all. God wants us to use our money to help those around us.
