- Talk about what the Macedonians were experiencing.
  - They were in a severe test of affliction.
  - They were poor.
  - Yet they were joyful because of the grace of God in Christ.
- They responded to the needs of others.
  - They gave of their own free will.
  - They gave beyond their means.
  - They gave generously.
- In **verse 5 of 2 Corinthians 8** it says, "(they gave) not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us."
  - They gave themselves first to Jesus because He gave Himself first to them.
- Jesus is the perfect example for us. We love because He first loved us.
  - Take care of those around us.
  - Help those in need.
  - Do whatever we can to take care of others. It is really simple.
