Genesis 41:47-49; 53-55

During the seven years of abundance the land produced plentifully. Joseph collected all the food produced in those seven years of abundance in Egypt and stored it in the cities. In each city he put the food grown in the fields surrounding it. Joseph stored up huge quantities of grain, like the sand of the sea; it was so much that he stopped keeping records because it was beyond measure.

1 Key Concepts

 - Pharaoh trusted Joseph to save wisely so that the Egyptians would have plenty of food, so much food that Joseph stopped keeping track of it all.
 - Joseph was saving for the future.
 - Joseph knew that there would be a famine and he wisely saved with God's help.
- God wants us also to save.
 - God has given us many gifts and wants us to use them wisely.
 - God wants us to make wise decisions about the things that we have.
- Proverbs 21:20 says," In the house of the wise are stores of choice food and oil, but a foolish man devours all he has."
 - The foolish man doesn't save.
 - He sees no reason to save.
 - Yet the time will come when he will have nothing left.
- God wants us to save for our future.
 - Don't be like the foolish man.
 - Everyone needs to save.
