For weeks she said little about what she was feeling. But then one day she came home from a friend's birthday party with a bright red helium balloon.


She went into the house and came out carrying the balloon with an envelope attached with a piece of string. The envelope was addressed to her grandfather in heaven up high.

This is the first and most important point: that all our prayers should be based on obedience to God no matter who we are, whether we are sinners or saints, worthy or unworthy.
